In 1867, Cheyenne Warriors gave the nickname of "Buffalo Soldiers" to the African American cavalry out of respect for their fierce fighting ability. Come and hear the "Texas Story" of the 9th Cavalry and the 24th and 25th Infantry Regiments. The Education Department provides storytelling programs free of charge.
